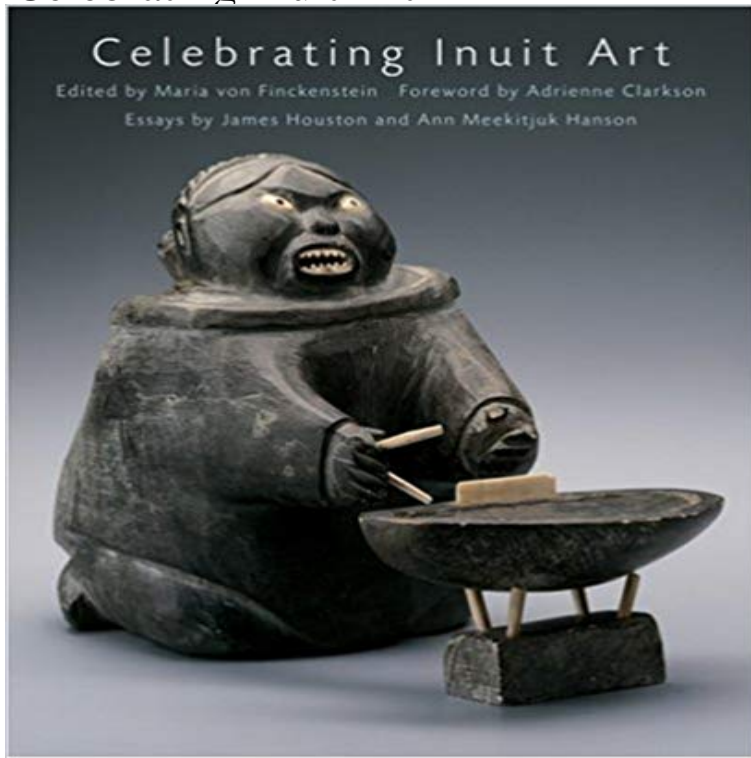


Celebrating Inuit Art
