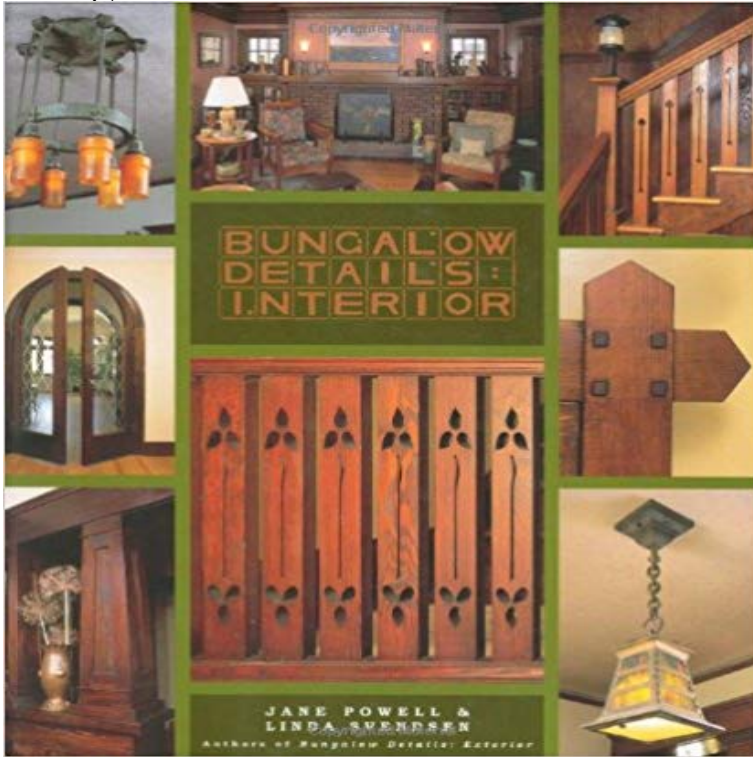


Bungalow Details Interior
