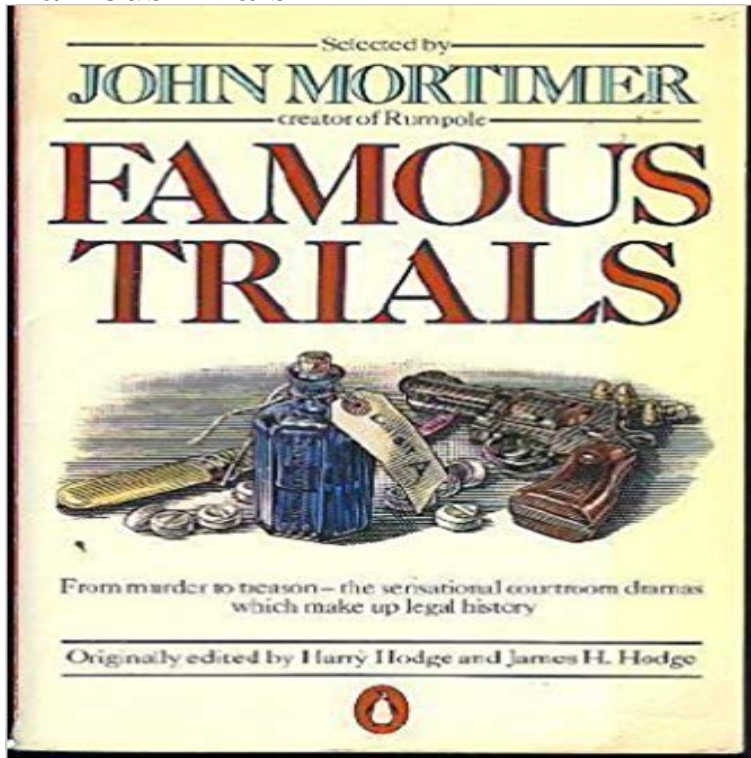


Famous Trials
