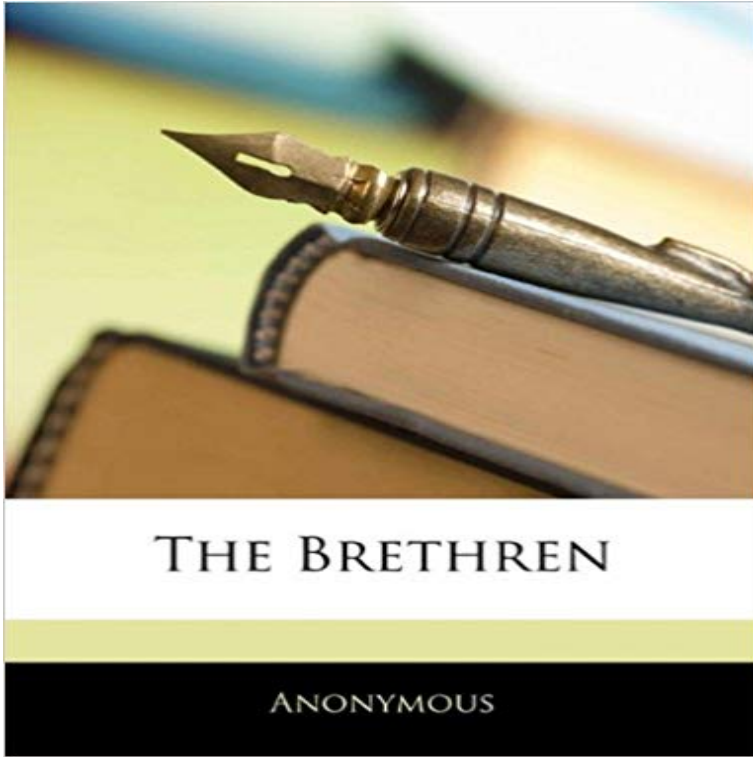


The Brethren
